ABOUT DEONTAY WILDER

Deontay Wilder, a life-long resident of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, is the World Boxing Council heavyweight champion. He won a bronze medal for the U.S. Olympic boxing team at the 2008 Beijing Games and after turning pro took on the nickname "The Bronze Bomber."

Wilder, 30, who has a professional record of 37-0 with 36 KOs, got a late start in boxing, taking up the sport to try to earn money when he was 19-years old after learning that his daughter, Naieya, would be born with spina bifida. Before his professional career took off, Wilder worked three jobs to help pay the hospital bills. After his daughter was born he made her a promise that he would become heavyweight champion of the world. He made good on that promise when he defeated Bermane Stiverne for the WBC title on Jan. 17, 2015.

His next goal is to be the undisputed heavyweight champion of the world – the first one since Lennox Lewis in 2000. He is well on his way to accomplishing that goal.
